B. J. Oropeza, Ph.D., University of Durham (England), is Professor of Biblical and Religious Studies at Azusa Pacific University and Seminary (Azusa, CA). His many academic publications include works such as *Perspectives on Paul: Five Views* (Baker Academic), the *Scripture, Texts, and Tracings* series (Fortress Academic), *Practicing Intertextuality* (Cascade), *1 Corinthians* (New Covenant Commentary series), *Exploring Second Corinthians* (SBL Press), *Jews, Gentiles, and the Opponents of Paul* (Cascade), and *Jesus and Paul* (Festschrift for James D. G. Dunn; T. & T. Clark). He founded the Intertextuality in the New Testament Section of the Society of Biblical Literature and is on the editorial board of the *Rhetoric of Religious Antiquity* series (SBL Press). He is also a member of the *Studiorum Novi Testamenti Societas* (SNTS) and contributed to the translation of the New Revised Standard Version updated edition of the Bible (NRSVue). Oropeza's current interests include Pauline studies, Romans, new and post-new perspectives on Paul, and Intertextual studies.
